ANNUAL MANAGER'S MEETING - A SUCCESS

Hilton Garden Inn – Highway 68, Greensboro, NC April 24-25, 2019

WEDNESDAY, APRIL 24:

President Ed Pearce kicked off the 2019 Manager's Meeting with a meeting overview and a video from Prominent Pumps, a metering pump company represented by Saladin Pump & Equipment and Tencarva in Arkansas. The video was an inspiring example of a company that prioritizes "taking care of each other". Ed encouraged a focus on teamwork and helping each other succeed, citing examples from the video.

Next, Ed Pearce with Dave Dressner, Compliance and Safety Manager, explained EDIC, Elite Distributors Insurance Company, of which Tencarva is not only a policyholder but also a part owner. Tencarva uses EDIC to mitigate insurance costs risk through effective loss control and claim management. Dave Dressner explained JSA, Job Safety Analysis, as well as many safety initiatives taking place around the company. Ed Pearce followed by giving the State of the Company address showing graphs of how the entire company is experiencing significant financial growth, with trends from 2017 to 2019.



Henry Ritchie followed with a discussion on the Fabrication and Uniguard departments. He explained Uniguard's remarkable growth in sales outside of the Tencarva footprint, and that the recently expanded production area and new router table, as well as managerial changes have boosted production. Henry indicated that fabrication had experienced a period of decline in activity but that recently things have started looking up. He encouraged the sales team to continue looking for opportunities to sell fabrication services.

Next, Jeff Stack, Continuous Improvement Training Specialist, and Eddie Rhyne, Secretary-Treasurer, reviewed the IFS implementation. Eddie reviewed the financial side of the implementation and assured that we were still running under budget. Jeff Stack discussed the training strategy, displayed the tutorial system, and demonstrated the IFS system with test data.

Jennifer Nordbladh, recently promoted as of April 1st to Human Resources Manager, gave a very entertaining presentation. Jennifer launched onto the stage punctuated with heavy electric guitar music, and then commenced a comedic video of her and JaMeka

Price, Human Resources Assistant, performing a counterpoint skit. Jennifer explained the recently implemented EAP, Employee Assistance Program. The EAP program connects any employee with master level clinicians to discuss a large range of life issues at or outside work. She stressed calling for help at 800-327-2251, or online at portal.BHSonline.com, username TENCARVA. "It's a new HR department moving in a new direction," says Jennifer.

Rob Pohlmann, IT Director, gave an update that covered a broad array of topics ranging from network throughput and failover strategy to Cyber Security. He showed the results from February and March of the phishing security test. He handed out stuffed fish-shaped awards to those who did not fall prey to the phishing exercise. After the day ended, the attendees were invited to headquarters for a Pig Pickin' (see pg 3).

THURSDAY, APRIL 25:

The day began with Ed Pearce explaining the Tencarva Stock Purchase plan, followed by Henry Ritchie discussing the current make up of the company's service and repair. Henry showed that the Tencarva Service Department is comprised of 67 mechanics, found in 14 different locations across 8 States, with 7 repair engineers and 12 repair coordinators spanning a range from Chesapeake, VA to Beaumont, Texas – 1,126 miles. He said the service department handled 5,183 repair jobs in 2018 and the repair footprint under Tencarva's roofs (79,050 ft²) is almost 2 acres.

Ron Bowen, Industrial VP, presented recent updates from Xylem Pumps introducing several new pump models, and recent Goulds Pumps news. Ron emphasized that the i-Alert 2 v3 are back on the shelf and ready to sell! Steve Newsome, VP Industrial Sales, presented an update on Gorman Rupp, SEEPEX, Wilden, John Crane, and Fusion Mixers, showing growth in all areas with new entrant Fusion Fluid Equipment as showing remarkable potential for activity.

Walter Hieber, Marketing Manager, presented an overview of the marketing department's activities since 2018, including a fullyear marketing calendar implemented this year. He shared it has saved significant time and money by aggregating bulk printing orders regularly and allowing better time management. After displaying the brochure updates for the industrial, municipal, ESSCO and Uniguard divisions, the presentation was completed by announcing that Jennifer Pacini, Marketing Department Intern, will be hired as full-time Marketing Coordinator on June 1st (see pg 7).

Ed gave encouraging closing remarks and explained nothing we do can change the past, but everything we do can change the future. He urged the company to stay the course, focus on our customers, protect and enhance our brands, investinourfutures and remember our roots. Edshowed examples of recent company enhancements; the IFS implementation, 3 new sales trainees as well as facility improvements, and also the creation of several new positions including a full-time service salesperson, a low pressure sewer specialist and a gear box repair coordinator as examples of the company investing in our future. The Manager's Meeting concluded before lunch, and attendees were thanked for attending. A Stockholders meeting was held shortly thereafter.

SPOTLIGHT ON ESSCO: AWARDED FIBER DYNAMICS PROJECT

If your focus is pumps and process equipment, it's easy to assume that ESSCO's focus is pump controls and enclosures. But ESSCO is so much more than just control panels and drives for pumps, as you will soon learn. ESSCO recently was awarded a very elaborate project by Fiber Dynamics, Inc. of High Point, North Carolina, makers of nonwoven fiber fabrics. This project allowed them to showcase some of the top-notch electrical engineering control design that sets ESSCO apart from the competition. Fiber Dynamics Inc. manufactures nonwoven textiles which are found in hundreds of household items such as diapers, dust masks, filters, wipes, surgical gowns, speaker covers, trunk liners, as well as many others.

"This is a very large project, and it's pushing the boundaries of our facility work space."

Don Benton explains that Fiber Dynamics has been a great customer of ESSCO's for many years. "When they needed to expand and add a new production line, they came to us because we've had successful experience upgrading other process lines in their facility. We were awarded the entire project including providing gear reducers, motors, drives and controls for the whole process line including winders, extruders, heaters and conveyors. This is a very large project, and it's pushing the boundaries of our facility work



space. This is a multi-million-dollar project for our customer. We are very pleased to be a large part of it." It's a very elegant and sophisticated system. The heart of the entire project is a Mitsubishi PLC, which runs the whole process line. The PLC communicates to the system via an Ethernet I/P protocol providing control integration of all the drives, heaters including two HMI (Human Machine Interface) systems which have two 15" screens to allow the graphical control of the entire system. ESSCO developed in house the PLC and HMI programs and will soon commission the entire system during a one week start up process. ESSCO utilized a switchgear manufacturer to provide them the very large panel to house all of the drive and heaters inclusive of the incoming switch gear that powers the whole line. The cabinet lineup is approximately 40 ft. long and 12 ft wide. It has a 4000 amp 460V bus running down the middle of the structure. The complete structure will be UL listed per the customers specifications. ESSCO is honored to be entrusted to provide this critical system to their customer and excited to see it in operation.
