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

I never forgot!" Ken may joke, but he credits the sacrifices of those early days with the success Tencarva enjoys today.

Before retiring, Ken had begun introducing Alan Johnson to his contacts years ago to make a smooth transition. Per Alan, "It was very nice having that intermediate person. Ken is great at giving feedback on how to read people in different circumstances. By the time we met, he had already been doing the job for 20+ years, so he has great gut instinct."

Brian Delaney agrees. "He's all about taking care of the customer." Eastman Chemical voted Ken their Top Supplier multiple times throughout their relationship. It should come as no surprise that Ken was one of the top ten salespeople for Tencarva.

It's no surprise this energy led Chris to success, especially in new product sales. In 2001, Chris even had an opportunity to work with Boeing to assist NASA on pump replacements for the Shuttle Launch pad.

Chris's drive didn't lessen outside of work. He's done cabinetmaking, he tinkers with cars, and has been known to ride into annual sales meetings on a motorcycle in full leather gear. He's even building a radio-controlled lawnmower that runs on tracks like a tank. In retirement, it's unlikely Chris will slow down at all. After marrying wife Carrie a few years ago, the pair have kept one another moving, either in her Mustang Shelby GT500 or his C8 Corvette.

It's obvious David took his role seriously as a colleague and mentor.

David McDougald likes to describe the early days of Tencarva in Arkansas as "the wild west." When Bill Strong got the Goulds contract for Arkansas in 1995, new branch manager Jon Watson brought David on as the first sales engineer. Having previously worked for a competitor, David knew the opportunity to sell Goulds pumps was too good to pass up. He remembers thinking, "I may never get another chance to sell Goulds pumps in my lifetime if I don't take this." But starting with just one line was a risk. Then after his biggest sales year ever, he left his job and took on what he describes as a "real pioneering effort."

Jack Miller, president of Tencarva at the time, let loose David's proven sales drive, encouraging him to leverage their Goulds contract to get in the door and then use his contacts to buy and resell anything he could. David started networking, built up a new customer base in a new territory, and the profits came in. Born and raised in Arkansas, David was the perfect person to grow Tencarva in the state, and grow it did.

Over the past 25 years, Tencarva's footprint in Arkansas has grown to three branches, most recently expanding to open the El Dorado branch. Don Wirth had entrusted David to manage the Springdale and Little Rock branches. That trust expanded for a few years as David also took over the El Dorado branch. After all that driving around, he's glad to hand the steering wheel to Micah McCall.

Now that he's off the road, David doesn't have a retirement plan per se. Dealing with some health issues, he is focused on getting healthy to make sure his retirement life is as full as possible. David has a large family, with 24-year-old son Logan having just graduated from Harding College, and daughter Allyson, 34, and her husband, Jonathon, busy with sons Lucas, 7, Maddox, 5, Owen, 3, and Henry, 7 months. A 25 YEAR ADVENTURE: CHUCK MCCaughey

Chuck is quick to tell you he's not got the traditional background of a Tencarva sales engineer. Now Branch Manager for Florida's Municipal Division in Lakeland, FL, Chuck's journey from sales trainee reads more like a screenplay than a resume, starting with the fact that Neil Armstrong, American hero, presented Chuck with his Eagle Scout award.

A Secondary Education graduate of the University of Florida, Chuck started his career teaching high school science and coaching the football team. His tenure only lasted 2-3 years, but that was enough for Chuck to see many of his star players head off to D1 schools. His biggest claim to fame is the time he spent coaching Cleveland Gary, who went on to play for the L.A. Rams.

From there, he spent 12 years running his own residential contracting firm. Along the way, he found time to spend over 30 years in the world of martial arts, meeting big names, and even having the opportunity to be on TV as a ring announcer for ESPN.

When Tencarva purchased Hudson Pump, Chuck was offered the opportunity to move into the newly created Specialty Products Group

and, shortly after, became the manager of that group for over 15 years. In 2019, he was offered a new challenge and was asked to lead the Florida Municipal Team after Nate Geiger retired. Chuck readily accepted the opportunity and made the move, leaving behind the faster-paced industrial sales. He notes, "When you're involved in bidding Municipal jobs, there's a process. A lot more working parts. Working with the Owner, their Engineer, the actual bid, the Contractor, Engineer approval and startup—this is different than the Industrial side, but a welcome change."

Chuck isn't the only one in the family that embraces challenges. His wife, Lynn, is a licensed Nurse Practitioner currently working with the elderly. Together with their two daughters, Lauren, 14, and Catherine, 16, they also live on a working farm. Chuck refers to himself as a "Green Acres gentleman farmer," filling his off-hours with property maintenance and caring for their many horses and cattle.

Chuck's pride in his family and his employment shine through his conversations. "At Tencarva, we have a phenomenal group of people.

When I first came to Tencarva, I was told by a very senior sales engineer that no two days would ever be the same, and I would learn something new every day. That's held so true. I don't struggle to get up and go to work. I want to see what the next day's going to bring."
